Qualified entries are then evaluated by a team of judges comprised of the Detroit Center for Civil Discourse professionals The team of judges may, at their sole discretion, consult with additional experts to assist in evaluating the merits of each submission. The team of judges will identify which applicants will be named Fellows and contact applicants on or before June 30th, 2019 with an official notice of acceptance.
